One of the five membership responsibilities we have at our church is the responsibility to "contribute" and a key way we contribute is through financial giving. The key New Testament principle of financial stewardship is generous, cheerful giving. I believe this is the kind of giving that pleases God.

Paul wrote about generous, cheerful giving in 2 Corinthians 9:6-7—The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. Jesus also celebrates generous, cheerful giving in Mark 12 when He and his disciples witness a variety of people putting in various amounts of money into the offering box. Rich people put in large sums while a poor widow contributed two small copper coins, amounting to a penny. What Jesus says next must have caught the disciples by surprise—Truly, I say to you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the offering box. For they all contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on (vs. 43-44).

I'm happy to share with you that our giving did exceed last year's budget and last year's actual expenses. Our giving exceeded our budget by \$58 and exceeded actual spending by \$6,553. I'm also thrilled that we recorded another record year of giving to the Lottie Moon International Missions Offering—we surpassed the \$12,000 mark! Thank you for giving to God's work in and through our church.

I'd encourage us to prayerfully consider how God would have us give this year. We should ask ourselves, "Are we giving cheerfully and generously? Are we giving sacrificially and faithfully? Are we stewarding well the financial resources God has given us" If we honestly ask ourselves these questions and then respond as God leads, I believe we'll have another good year of giving at our church.

Here's a quick update on my doctoral studies. By the time you receive this newsletter in the mail, I will have formally submitted

my paper to Southern Seminary. Sometime in February or March, I will be summoned to campus in Louisville to defend my paper before two professors. If the Lord extends His favor to me (and the two professors!), I will make any corrections they advise and then should receive a passing grade. At that point, all that will be left is graduation on May 18th. I can't thank you enough for all of your prayers, support, and encouragement throughout this arduous but satisfying experience!
