As we read the Bible, it does not take us long to realize that God uses people to help accomplish His plans and purposes in our world. For God to do this is an expression of grace, especially when we consider that God can accomplish His will without our help. God is self-sufficient and has no needs or deficiencies (Acts 17:25). He does what He pleases in heaven and earth (Psalm 135:6) and all things happen according to the counsel of His will (Ephesians 1:11). If God had a need, He would not tell us (Psalm 50:12). In other words, God is God!

Now consider that this God delights in using His people to proclaim the gospel, evangelize the lost, love others and meet physical needs in His name, and simply be His hands and feet in our world. When we stop and think about it, it is a humbling reality! Paul adds another facet to this in

1 Corinthians 1:26-29: For consider your calling, brothers: not many of you were wise according to worldly standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. Don't miss what Paul writes here. Most of us are not wise according to worldly standards. We are not powerful. We are not of noble birth. We are foolish and weak and low and despised and yet...God calls us to labor in His name to help bring about His will. Wow!

Why would God use people like us? Why would God purposefully choose and call unlikely people to preach, teach, evangelize, serve, love, and minister in His name? Henry Blackaby in *Experiencing God* provides some help: "When God does exceptional things through unexceptional people, then others recognize that only God could have done it. If you feel weak, limited, ordinary, take heart! You are the best material through which God can work." *Only God could have done it*. God uses unworthy people like us for our good and His glory.

Knowing and doing the will of God is the theme of *Experiencing God*. As you know, our *Experiencing God Weekend* is quickly approaching (August 17-19) and our *Experiencing God* small group study begins the next Sunday (August 26). Sign-ups are still going on and you'll find additional information about both of these opportunities in the newsletter.

I'd ask that you prayerfully consider taking part in both the weekend and small group study. Both are simply tools by which we can draw closer to God. We're praying for 225 people to be part of the weekend and small group study. Will you be part of this number?
