The four Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) paint a fascinating picture of Jesus' life and ministry. From my perspective, one of the most interesting aspects of Jesus is His propensity to both attract and repel certain types of people. Those on the outside of respectable culture were more likely to embrace Him. Those on the inside? They seemed prone to take offense at Him. Understanding this dynamic gets to the very heart of why Jesus came and gets to the very heart of the gospel itself.

In his book *The Jesus I Never Knew*, author Philip Yancey explains this reality. He writes, "The more unsavory the characters, the more at ease they seemed to feel around Jesus. People like these found Jesus appealing: a Samaritan social outcast, a military officer of the tyrant Herod, a quisling tax collector, a recent host to seven demons." We can easily add people to his list—the blind, the lame, the invalid, the prostitute, those mostly outside of acceptable social and religious circles. The lower you are, the more appealing Jesus is.

Yancey also explains the opposite: "Jesus got a chilly response from more respectable types. Pious Pharisees thought Him uncouth and worldly, a rich young ruler walked away shaking His head, and even the open-minded Nicodemus sought a meeting under the cover of darkness." The most pointed words Jesus spoke were directed to the most outwardly pious people. For example, Jesus pronounces a series of devastating woes in Matthew 23 against the Pharisees for their religious and moral hypocrisy. Perhaps the end of verse 3 summarizes His indictment of them: "They preach but do not practice."

The mission of Jesus is not to make good people better. He came to rescue those who know they are drowning. When you are sinking, you are uniquely positioned and eager to accept a lifeline. Jesus explains His mission when He says to Zaccheus, "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10).

Our new sermon series, "Grace Encounters: Studies in the Gospel of Luke," kicks off this Sunday and will take us through Easter. Over these next eight weeks we will highlight and celebrate the theme of grace in Luke's Gospel. Grace connects to and extends what we've been learning about addiction and I look forward to sharing how grace is central to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

Will you commit to being at church each Sunday through Easter? God is honored when we gather with His people for worship and mutual encouragement.
