The book of Proverbs is full of practical wisdom spanning a range
of topics and subjects. While the Holy Spirit inspired wisdom
contained throughout the book is applicable to everyone, it is
important to note that the book is essentially a transfer of
wisdom from a father to his son. Consider how the opening
chapters begin:

Hear, my son, your father's instruction... (1:8)
My son, if you receive my words and treasure up my
commandments with you... (2:1)
My son, do not forget my teaching, but let your heart keep my
commandments... (3:1)

Hear, O sons, a father's instruction, and be attentive, that you may gain insight... (4:1)

My son, be attentive to my wisdom; incline your ear to my understanding (5:1)

My son, if you have put up security for your neighbor, have given your pledge for a stranger... (6:1)

My son, keep my words and treasure up my commandments with you (7:1)

And now, O sons, listen to me: blessed are those who keep my ways. (8:32)

The Bible places great responsibility on fathers. We're called to love, lead, serve, provide, nurture, discipline, admonish, sacrifice on behalf of, and spiritually shepherd the children God places under our care. No doubt, being the type of father the Bible describes is a noble and difficult task. Yet, we also have God's promise of grace and power in the midst of our weakness (2 Corinthians 11:9).

In their book *A Guide to Biblical Manhood*, authors Randy Stinson and Dan Dumas note that in previous times, it was normal for fathers to spend a lot of time with their sons on the farm or running the family business—"In those settings, dads could teach their sons practical lessons as well as lessons of leadership, protection, and provision expected of manhood." They add that with changes in our culture and society, fathers now typically spend much less time with their sons which means they have less time to teach or model how to learn basic life skills.

The authors then include "Twenty Five Things a Dad Should Teach a Boy." The list is not meant to be exhaustive, but rather as a starting point for fathers with their sons (or daughters, for that matter). Here's a sampling of their list:

- Speak in public
- Read good books
- Play an instrument
- Build a fire
- Camp out (pitch a tent, cook over the fire, etc.)
- Carve a turkey
- Light a grill
- Jump start a car
- Tie a knot (square not, bowline, taut-line, figure eight)
- Use basic tools (hammer, saw, wrench, screwdriver)
- Handle a gun and a knife (for safety, protection, sport, and hunting)

- Skin an animal
- Be a gentlemen
- Iron a shirt
- Manage money
- Shake a hand
- Handle loss (sports and games in preparation for loss in work and relationships)

Father's Day is near which affords us the opportunity to honor, appreciate, or remember the man we call "father." His influence has likely been significant and we would do well to express our gratitude for his role in our life. If the mention of "father" brings a sad or sour taste to your mouth, remember your Heavenly Father, who demonstrated His love for you by giving Jesus to rescue you from your sin. No greater gift of love can be found.

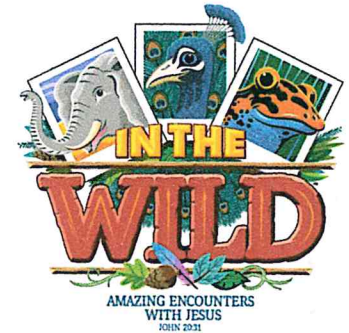

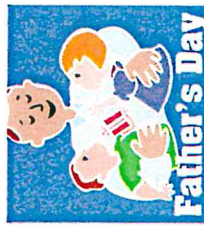
