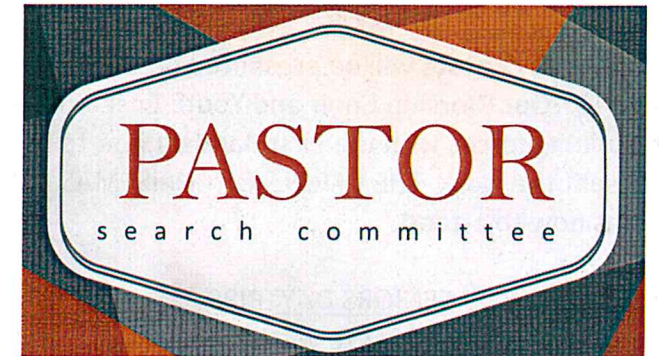

(Nevada) I minister with my wife, Nichole, in Reno, the second most unchurched city in the United States. The rocks are hard, the dirt is hard, and the hearts of the people are hard! It's very difficult to get people to come to church, so the constant challenge is to find ways and places to share the gospel. We do a lot of community outreach like Backyard bible Clubs, VBS (Vacation Bible School), and church events around the holidays.

I find the biggest hindrance in people accepting the gospel is sin. They think they are living life just fine without Jesus, so why would they need Him? Jonathan was a young man in our church who was saved and serving in church but still not submitted to God. I have ministered to him for several years, and I'm happy to say that recently he finally gave his life fully to Christ. He has given up drinking and is now focused on serving God. I baptized him in Lake Tahoe in January as a final outward sign of his full submission to Christ.

I am currently in my church planter apprenticeship with the North American Mission Board, and I am also serving as the associate pastor of Faith Ministry in Reno. Nichole and I are also assisting in leading the youth group at the church. I find it very rewarding when I get the opportunity to share the gospel with people who have never heard it before.

Please pray for the hearts of the people in Reno to soften so we can share the gospel with them. Please pray for workers for our new church. We need a core team of committed people and a group of people willing to help us launch.

INASMUCH

Thanks to all the volunteers who gave up their Saturday to work in INASMUCH, Saturday September 7th. Wanda and I counted 105 volunteers that came to participate in a variety of projects. There were 203 people from the community that attended the clothing giveaway on Friday night and Saturday morning. Breakfast was served at the church for the community and volunteers enjoyed ribeye steak sandwiches and green beans at the county extension office. All of the projects were completed except for one, and that will be completed at a later date.
