

North American Mission Board Missionary of the Week – Beverly Holmes

Greetings from Warsaw, Poland. "Warsaw is a city with a beautiful church on every corner where people come to fulfill their religious duty on Sundays & Holidays. There are liturgical prayers, lectionary readings, and the lighting of candles. Yet for most, God only dwells in the church, not in the hearts of people.

"Part of our strategy as church planters is to involve people in Bible-reading groups and allow the Holy Spirit to open their eyes to the truth. We host English clubs in schools and community centers, do charity work, and partner with the three Baptist churches in Warsaw to proclaim the gospel. Because many people are interested in learning about American culture, we plan events throughout the year to share American holiday traditions. These are opportunities to meet new people, develop friendships, and invite people to join a Bible-reading group.

"During this Advent season, you can pray for families who have received a Scripture-reading plan for each day of Advent. Pray that they will understand that Jesus came to be their Lord and Savior, not just a baby in a manger. In the coming year, as you celebrate each holiday, remember to pray for the people of Poland. Pray that they will understand that God is not limited to the walls of church and that each moment of their lives is an opportunity to worship Him. Please pray that people attending one of the three Bible-reading groups in our neighborhood will become strong disciples and draw their family and friends into god's family."
