

Trey Van Camp

For eight months, members of Passion Creek Church prayed for the Johnson* family. The Johnsons had visited the church for six weeks but then stopped coming. Trey Van Camp, who leads the church, said he felt led to continue praying for the family, not knowing they had begun attending a Latter-day Saints church in town. The family joined the LDS church, but they continued to watch Trey's church online.

"They eventually came back to the church and received Jesus as their Lord and Savior, and we were able to baptize the whole family." Said Trey, a Southern Baptist church planter. Try said his greatest joy comes from leading people through discipleship and spiritual transformation. "I absolutely love helping people identify the stage and season God has them in and ... steps they can take to become more like Jesus."

Trey said one of the hardest parts of ministry is seeing people leave the church for one reason or another, particularly young people who leave in search of entertainment and purpose. "They believe life would be better if they only had 'this or that,' and they run from one distraction to another," he said.

Pray God would provide a permanent home for Passion Creek Church. Pray, too, more people would come to faith in Jesus.

"More and more families are coming who have an agnostic, atheist, or Mormon background," Trey said. "Each one presents a unique opportunity to show the beauty of King Jesus."

TJ's Take

We've been faced with a potentially deadly virus, government restrictions and lockdowns, financial concerns, civil unrest, violent riots, a draining election cycle, conspiracy theories, and more. All the while, we are continually surrounded by the ever-present evils and difficulties in our world.

Everywhere you turn, there is so much despair. There is so much bad news. So much heartbreak as the waves of life come crashing down upon us over and over again with no sign of stopping.

At what point do we give up? At what point do we stop hoping? At what point does hopelessness and despair finally conquer our ability to get up in the morning? Where do we turn?

When difficulty presents itself in this life, those of us who are in Christ must return time and time again to the truth of what Scripture says. To the gospel of Jesus Christ. To the good, good news.

See, the gospel reminds us that since the days of Adam in the Garden of Eden, all of us—whether men or women, white or black, young or old—have sinned. We are born with hearts that are inclined toward evil. And our world is likewise devastated by the effects of this sin. The world is filled with sin and evil and death. In short, there is a lot of bad news.

Our sin is not just some violation we've committed against humanity. No, our sin is sin against a holy, majestic, righteous God. Because God cannot simply tolerate sin, our sin demands punishment—it demands death. We deserve to die for the sin we have committed. In fact, nothing short of death will do.

But in his great love for us, God sent his Son in the form of man to take that punishment—to take that death—for us. He died so that we don't have to. And in his death, the righteousness of God has been given to those who repent, who turn from their sin and believe in him. This is the great exchange—Jesus suffers and dies in our stead, and we receive the righteousness from his perfect life on his behalf. The fragrance of that glorious grace is intoxicating.

That, fellow saints, is good news. That is why it is called the gospel. And that is where I put my hope.

I know that at some point today, more heartache and pain is going to come. And then again tomorrow. Despair seems to be all around us. But I know that our God is bigger than all of it. Our God is sovereign. Our God is in control. Our God is seated on his throne in heaven, not at all surprised by what might happen today. We are not spinning around in orbit flailing about hopelessly. We are under his control. His counsel shall stand, and he will accomplish all his purpose (Isaiah 46:10).

Our God has a love that is intoxicating. A love that overwhelms. A love that went to the cross for the sins of his people. A love that expresses good news in a world seemingly without it.

And one day, God will ultimately put an end to all of the troubles of this world. There will be no more bad news. God is going to fix everything. Jesus will come again and death and evil will be defeated for good. There will be no more despair. There will be no more hopelessness.

And even though the tragedies of today are sometimes seemingly unbearable, remember that the sufferings of this world are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us (Romans 8:18). And the afflictions of today are preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison for tomorrow (2 Corinthians 4:17).

That is good, good news.

It is hard to believe that it is getting closer to a year since the pandemic started. Yes, it has been difficult, confusing, and downright frustrating. But God is good and we still moved forward with ministry here at Central. It is encouraging to see families back in the sanctuary at Sunday morning worship. It has been amazing to see the number of students participating on Sunday night student ministry and it is exciting that we are going to be starting back up some other ministries in the very near future.

One of these ministries is AWANA. Starting February 21 from 6:30-7:30 on Sunday evening, AWANA will be starting for our Kindergarten through 5th grade. Things will look a little different. Please notice that it will start at 6:30. There will not be a meal, but a snack will be served in the classroom. AWANA has also been moved to the third floor. Every parent will need to come and check their child

in at the registration table. Please do not simply drop your child off at the door. A parent must come inside to check their child in. The parent will receive a receipt with a code and that receipt will allow parents to pick their kids up at 7:30. Please understand that this is a new safety policy that we have put in place to add extra security for our children. Also remember that masks will be required at AWANA.

Along with AWANA, a family ministry event will take place on February 27TH. We will be heading to Perfect North slopes for some snow tubing. This is for all families. I have reserved 50 spots, and it is first come, first serve. The cost is \$23 per person. Since we are unable to take vans this year, parents will have to drive. We will meet at the church on Saturday morning. A waiver will have to be filled out for everyone tubing. Remember, this is tubing only!
