Greg saw the flyer announcing a free lunch provided by the Christian student club on campus. Although he was a Christian, Greg felt he had strayed from his fath. He was interested in finding someone with whom he could have spiritual conversations.

During the free lunch, Greg met Kevin Cox, a North American Mission Board collegiate missionary and the two talked. Greg then began attending Kevin's weekly Bible studies, where he gained a hunger for God's Word.

"Greg started a Bible study with friends that grew dunring COVID to having more than 20 students involved – many not Christians!" Kevin said. "Greg is now passionate about having gospel conversations with his friends and helping them know Christ."

Kevin coordinates Christian student clubs at six colleges in Worcester, Massachusetts, where he and his family live. He also serves with The Church on Seven Hills, where he and his wife help with Bible studies, children's ministry and worship.

"Ministry in New England is about embracing both joy and pain," he said. "In order to find the one who weeps when hearing the gospel, you have to receive rejection from ten others".

"The Lord is teaching us to find greater joy in Him that we might 'consider it all joy...when [we] encounter various trials'" (James 1:2 NASB).

Pray students and their friends would come to know Jesus during this challenging season. Pray, too, God would raise up more leaders who are committed to planting a new church in the city.

TJ's Take

As many of you know, by the grace of God I headed down to Texas last month to attend my graduation upon the completion of my PhD in Systematic Theology at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. I do not have the words to adequately describe the feeling of relief and satisfaction I experienced for finally finishing this degree.

When I yielded to the call to ministry that God placed on my life, I sought counsel from several pastors who encouraged me to pursue formal theological education. In 2012, I began my seminary journey with the intention of preparing myself

to be someone who rightly divides the word of truth (2 Timothy 2:15). I went to school to prepare myself to serve as a senior pastor who could lead a local church in the study and practice of God's Word. However, when I completed my Masters of Divinity in 2015, I did not sense that I had an adequate understanding of the Bible and theology to be able to help lead and shepherd a church. I knew that I wasn't quite ready in terms of my overall biblical understanding and training.

So, it was out of a sense of needing to better prepare for my role in pastoring that I sought out the opportunity to pursue the PhD. In other words, I did not aim to earn my doctorate for the accolades or a pay raise or in order to become a seminary professor. Rather, I pursued the degree in order to become better equipped to be able to serve the local church.

The academic journey over the past six years has certainly been demanding and arduous. It has taken a steady diet of late nights, early mornings, and extended study sessions. Saying "Yes" to a PhD means you are simultaneously saying "No" to countless other things.

Over the course of those years, I have gained a much deeper understanding of systematic theology and the cohesiveness of the biblical narrative. I have a much better foundation of the history of the church and the development of theology over the course of time. I have learned to think critically and have been able to read broadly. I'm thankful for the time I have been able to commit to this journey. But I'm especially thankful to be done!

I'm also thankful for the love and support you have shown me as a church family over the past year. You have prayed for me and encouraged me to keep going, even when I wanted to quit. Your support has meant more than you'll ever know. I look forward to continuing to serve our Lord together in the years to come.

And one more thing—I don't want anyone to refer to me as a Doctor. I'm still just your pastor!

Additionally, I am a Life Member of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA), a professional organization whose mission is "to inspire excellence and nurture lifelong involvement in choral music for everyone through education, performance, composition and advocacy." In a document dated May 19, 2021, ACDA summarized the latest CDC recommendations and results from the choral/singing-specific research ACDA helped sponsor: "If everyone in your group is fully vaccinated, the CDC says they can sing inside or outside without masks and without needing to follow the other protocols of distancing, ventilation, and so on."

Therefore, if you have been fully vaccinated—or are willing to take personal responsibility for being in a singing environment without having been vaccinated—we would love to have you join us when choir rehearsals resume in August without masks. (Full Disclosure: I have been fully vaccinated.)
