

MICKEY'S MUSINGS

"What is the Perfect Age" is the title of an article in the January 13, 2018 edition of the Wall Street Journal. The author considered the work of many researchers and pollsters in writing this article and shared the following conclusions. People in their 60's and 70's are more "time-affluent" and less anxious than other age ranges. A 2016 study indicated that people at 65 to 74 reported having more fun than any other age group. In a 2015 study, researchers found that worry follows us from 20-50, but that worries and stress "begin to diminish at about age 50, and well-being climbs to about age 70, when people are less anxious but still healthy."

So, I ask of the Builder and Boomer generations, what are you doing with your time? Your well-being? Your worry-free days? So much of our society focuses on working to retirement, and at age 54 I see it on the horizon—still a long way off, though—and I pray that we will be ready and able when that time comes. But one mustn't confuse retirement from employment with retirement from our calling as Christians. For there is

no mention in the Bible where the work is completed before death. Jesus, shortly before breathing his last on the cross declared, "It is finished!" Paul, writing on his deathbed, penned the following words to Timothy, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith."

Let me encourage you to continue the work. Take advantage of the freedom in your schedules to serve the Father in the community.

- Attend the Egg-stravaganza on April 5 and connect with parents and children. Share with them the hope you have in Jesus.
- Serve in Vacation Bible School on June 4-8.
 Share the love of Jesus with the children of our community
- Gather together for lunch and day trips and luncheons and retreats. We plan many of those, but there are other organizations in the area in which you can also be involved
- Be intentional about sharing your God-story with others. Remember, the Great Commission infers as you are going...

Whatever you do, don't quit. I heard a pastor the other day exhort the congregation to not quit. "Anyone can quit; it's easy. If it weren't, there probably wouldn't be so many doing it." Don't quit; finish the race!
