



Dear Church,

The Old Testament book of Ecclesiastes was written by the second wisest man to ever live, King Solomon. He asked the Lord to give him wisdom so that he might rule God's people properly, and the Lord graciously answered his prayer. The wisdom of Solomon became proverbial. Fortunately, the Lord led Solomon to record his wisdom in the Bible that future generations might benefit from it.

Not all of Solomon's life though, was lived in obedience to God. Solomon spent several years engaged in pursuits that he thought would bring him satisfaction, while deprioritizing his personal relationship with the Lord. The book of Ecclesiastes is the record of Solomon's pursuits, with chapter two being a summary of his worldly accomplishments.

Solomon built homes for himself, planted vineyards and gardens, he made parks and constructed reservoirs with which to water them. He had slaves, men and women singers, and a huge harem. He also amassed great wealth with an abundance of herds and flocks, silver and gold, to the extent that his kingdom exceeded all the kingdoms that came before it.

From a worldly point of view, Solomon had it made. One would think that he would be very happy, but that wasn't the case. The accumulation of wealth, accomplishments, and fame didn't bring the fulfillment he anticipated. Solomon expressed his disillusionment in Ecclesiastes 2:11, when he wrote

"Yet when I surveyed all that my hands had done and what I had toiled to achieve, everything was meaningless, a chasing after the wind; nothing was gained under the sun."

Solomon was right, life without God at the center is meaningless, regardless of how much one has accomplished. The Lord created us to know Him, to be in fellowship with Him, and to live our lives in such a way that He receives the glory He deserves. We need to prioritize our relationship with God and put Him at the center of our lives. When we do, we realize that life is deeply meaningful, and we can take satisfaction in the things that God has allowed us to accomplish.
