

We've all gone through seasons where we needed help. Maybe it was financial help that we needed or help with our job. Perhaps we needed someone to take us to an appointment due to the physical limitations that we had. Whatever the need might be, we tend to look to other people for help, rather than to God. We think, "if only I could get this person to help me, then everything would be fine."

Israel struggled with this very thing. Instead of looking to the Lord for all that they needed, they looked to man and wanted a king to rule over them. They insisted on a king, "such as all the other nations have." In asking for a king, they were rejecting the Lord as their king. Their insistence on a king did not yield the results they had hoped for, as Saul was an ungodly ruler that did many evil things.

A new shopper this week her husband lost his job and she is expecting their first child and they have lost their health insurance.
