



In one year alone, she wrote 18,000 letters to churches seeking support for missionaries. In that time, they were hand written – no email.

She raised support for the first two black female Baptist missionaries. She was also instrumental in procuring relief funds for Lottie Moon who was serving in China for 11 years without a furlough.

She embodied how we should be the hands and feet of Christ and therefore the offering for North American Missions was named for her.


