

Dear Church,

In John 1:29, when John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him, he said, "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" This was a bold statement by John, one that would be proven true as Jesus' public ministry unfolded. Jesus truly was the Lamb of God.

The origin of this title for Jesus finds its roots in the first Passover celebrated by Israel while they were still enslaved in Egypt. The Lord had sent nine devastating plagues upon the Egyptians, but Pharaoh's heart was still hardened, and he would not let the Israelites go. In preparation for the tenth and final plague, the Lord told His people to select unblemished male lambs and to slaughter them at the appointed time. They were to pour out the blood in a basin, dip in a hyssop branch, and apply the blood to the doorposts of their homes. At midnight, when the destroying angels passed through the land, they would see the blood and "pass over" the homes of the Israelites, thus sparing their firstborn sons.

What an amazing foreshadow of all that Jesus would do for us. He is that unblemished Lamb who is without sin. He gave His life for us and shed His blood on the wooden cross of Calvary. He has taken away our sins because we have trusted in Him for our salvation. As a result, the judgment of God "passes over" us, because our Passover Lamb was sacrificed in our place.

How incredible that Jesus would choose to die for us, that we might live through Him. He rose and conquered the grave so that the way to be saved would be available to all. We really cannot praise Him enough for what He has done. How about you, have you praised Him lately for the great things He has done on your behalf? If not, take a minute to do that right now. It's the best thing you can do for your soul. Praise the Lamb of God, that takes away the sin of the world!
